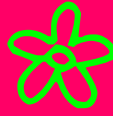

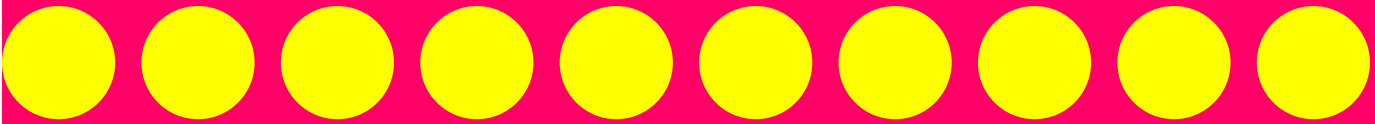
To my dear seniors,

of talent and that each and every one of you will go far in life. Fight for your dreams, never give up.

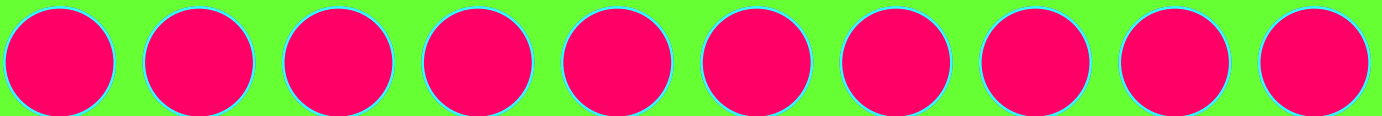
